Overview

This qualification supports the attainment of the skills and knowledge to develop, facilitate and coordinate projects for young people in a range of community based settings, to address the social, behavioural, welfare, health, developmental and safety needs of young people.

This training program is underpinned by the practice wisdom of Future Youth Initiative (FYI), a youth specific service at Relationships Australia South Australia. Students will engage and learn from Youth Workers in the field and eligible students can complete the work placement component at FYI.

Work Placement Requirements

To achieve competency for this qualification, 100 hours of on-the-job learning and assessment at a youth-specific service, must be completed.

A current Working with Children check (within the last 12 months) is required before commencing work placement.

Entry Requirements

All applicants will be required to undertake a suitability interview with the course coordinator.

Language, Literacy and Numeracy (LLN) Assessment

All applicants will be assessed for suitability and are required to undertake an online language, literacy and numeracy (LLN) assessment.
