



Diploma of Community Services CHC52015

This course is delivered in Adelaide only.

Overview

This qualification reflects the roles of community services workers involved in managing, coordinating and/or delivering of person-centred services to individuals, groups and communities.

At this level, workers have specialised skills in community services and work autonomously under broad directions from senior management. Workers are usually providing direct support to individuals or groups of individuals. Workers may also have responsibility for the supervision of other workers and volunteers and/or case management, program coordination or the development of new service and program opportunities.

This qualification will ensure that areas of commonality are highlighted across community services work, including the design and development of person-centred services and programs, the management of issues related to community services work and community engagement including human resource management and supervision of others.

Work Placement Requirements

To achieve competency for this qualification, 100 hours (minimum) of on-the-job learning and assessment must be completed. A current Working with Children check (within the last 12 months) is required before commencing work placement.

Entry Requirements

To gain entry into CHC52015 Diploma of Community Services we recommend prospective students' have sufficient relevant work experience to indicate likely success at this level, in a job role involving:

- The self-directed application of knowledge with substantial depth in some areas
- The exercise of independent judgement and decision-making
- The application of relevant technical and other skills

All applicants will be required to undertake a suitability interview with the course coordinator.

Language, Literacy and Numeracy (LLN) Assessment

All applicants will be assessed for suitability and are required to undertake an online language, literacy and numeracy (LLN) assessment.

Employment Opportunities

Upon completion students will be eligible to pursue any career in community services that involves direct client work, community education or development projects. Students will graduate with a set of skills to effectively design and deliver community service programs.
