Diploma of Counselling

Mid-Year Intake

Work with clients on personal and psychological issues using established counselling modalities.



Overview

This qualification reflects the role of counsellors who work with clients on personal and psychological issues using established counselling modalities. Students will develop their integrative approach to counselling through face-to-face simulations and assessment with practice leaders within Relationships Australia SA.

The training combines best practices in online and face-to-face delivery, supporting student engagement with regularly scheduled, synchronous classes and tutorials and asynchronous activities and assessments.

All students can access interactive e-textbooks and a course facilitator for ongoing support.

Students completing this course will be equipped with the skills and knowledge to work in a defined and supported counselling role in an established agency rather than in independent practice. This qualification will add practical experience to an existing qualification.

Entry Requirements

Priority will be given to people with a background in health, community services or education and those already providing services to support communities and individuals in either a volunteer or paid capacity.

All applicants must undertake a suitability interview with the course coordinator.

Study Requirements

The program offers a blend of face-to-face and online learning components. It includes 20 inperson classroom sessions, comprising both workshops and assessment days. Assessment days will be scheduled based on class size and may vary accordingly.

In addition to the face-to-face sessions, the course incorporates online tutorials and webinars focused on key subject areas, along with online forums to facilitate class discussions and engagement.

Participants should expect to dedicate approximately 10 to 15 hours per week to the program. This includes both scheduled learning and self-directed study outside of classroom time.

There is no required workplace component for the CHC51015 Diploma of Counselling.
